### YOU WILL BE GIVEN A COPY OF THIS INFORMATION SHEET

I am a PhD student at the University of Surrey and a PG Cert tutor at BIMM. I would like to invite you to participate in this research project which forms part of my PhD research. You should only participate if you want to; choosing not to take part will not disadvantage you in any way. Before you decide whether you want to take part, it is important for you to understand why the research is being done and what your participation will involve. Please take time to read the following information carefully and discuss it with others if you wish. Ask me if there is anything that is not clear or if you would like more information. Please do talk to others about the study if you wish - use #musostudy on social media. (Anything posted has the potential to become research data).

#### What is the purpose of the study?

We know that some students find studying at degree level quite a challenge, especially when combined with instrumental practice and working to pay for extra income etc. This study is designed to test a new model (Musostudy) to help address some of the main causes for this challenge. The model is designed for tutors to use in class to support students in studying independently and more effectively. I am specifically interested in how we can embed study skills into lessons. This will involve BIMM tutors using Musostudy principles to design their teaching and learning activities.

#### Why have I been invited to take part?

I am asking you to take part by implementing the model I have developed in your undergraduate teaching sessions at BIMM. I will provide a toolkit for you to develop teaching and learning activities (TLAs) based on the model. It will contain explanations of the elements of the model, how to generate TLAs, how to embed different study skills into practical, vocational and critical classes, how to design and run effective time management activities plus how to generate better attendance and engagement. Usable examples of all these elements will also be included.

As well as implementing the model I will ask you to feedback on each session, run surveys with students (maximum 2 per term) and video selected sessions. You will have to send me any data that you generate either electronically or in pre-paid envelopes which I will provide. The data I will be asking you for is the TLAs and lesson plans you create/use, your feedback on the model and its toolkit as well as your suggestions for improvement/development plus the surveys you carry out with students. Clear guidance and support on all this entails will be provided.

#### Do I have to take part?

Participation is voluntary. You do not have to take part. You should read this information sheet and if you have any questions you should ask me. You can withdraw your participation at any time prior to the end of the study, and I will collect no further data from you. If you would like to withdraw your data from the research please email me.

#### What will happen to me if I take part?

If you decide to take part you will be given this information sheet to keep and will be asked to sign a consent form. I will then contact you with the links to the musostudy website and all the materials you will need. I will contact you to discuss how to support you to plan your teaching for the following year, help you with implementing the model and talk about how to generate and gather data from your classes.

#### What are the possible benefits and risks of taking part?

Information from the research will help to develop an effective model for embedding study skills into classes. Information from the sessions you teach will help me to determine how to best develop the Musostudy Model and its toolkit to help students to improve their study skills. Taking part gives you access to TLAs to enhance your teaching of study skills. There are no anticipated risks to taking part in this evaluation.

#### How is the project being funded?

My PhD is part funded by BIMM. This study has been reviewed and received a Favourable Ethical Opinion from the University of Surrey Ethics Committee and the BIMM Research and Enterprise Committee.

### **Who is Handling My Data?**

The University of Surrey, as the sponsor, will act as the 'Data Controller' for this study. We will process your personal data on behalf of the controller and are responsible for looking after your information and using it properly. This information will include [your name and BIMM email address which is regarded as 'personal data']. We will use this information as explained in the 'What is the purpose of the study' section above.

### **What will happen to my data?**

As a publicly-funded organisation, we have to ensure when we use identifiable personal information from people who have agreed to take part in research, this data is processed fairly and lawfully and is done so on the basis of public interest. This means that when you agree to take part in this research study, we will use your data in the ways needed to conduct and analyse the research study.

All project data related to the administration of the project, (e.g. consent form) will be held for at least 6 years and all research data for at least 10 years in accordance with University policy. Your personal data will be held and processed in the strictest confidence, and in accordance with current data protection regulations.

Your rights to access, change or move your information are limited, as we need to manage your information in specific ways in order for the research to be reliable and accurate. If you decide to withdraw your data from the study, we may not be able to do so. We will keep the information about you that we have already obtained. To safeguard your rights, we will use the minimum personally-identifiable information possible.

**Personal Data** The personal information I will collect from you is your name and email address. You will be allocated a unique code and the research data (your responses to the surveys, lesson planning, reflective journals and any interview/focus group comments) will be held with this code in password protected files. Your personal information will be kept separately from the research data. At the end of the study your personal information will be deleted.

**Interviews/Focus Groups Audio recordings** of your interview/focus group will be made. Where they take place in person I will record them using my iPhone. Where sessions take place via Zoom or Skype (you can choose which you prefer) I will use the in-app recording device. These recordings will be transcribed and the written data will then be anonymised and the recordings destroyed. The transcription of the interview/focus group will be entered into a password protected electronic word document.

Once all data have been collected and entered electronically it will not be possible to identify you personally in the final research. All files will be stored on Surrey's secure server.

**Online Surveys** Your data will be held securely in the online survey portal ([onlinesurveys.ac.uk](http://onlinesurveys.ac.uk)) for one month. It will then be exported into to an Excel spreadsheet and held on Surrey's secure server in a password protected file ready for analysis. The online data will then be deleted. Once all data have been collected and entered electronically it will not be possible to identify you personally in the final research.

**Reflective Journals** You will email your data to me and I will store it securely in password protected files A on Surrey's secure server. After one month I will remove your personal information and analyse the data. Once all data have been collected and entered electronically it will not be possible to identify you personally in the final research.

### **What will happen to the results of the study?**

I will produce a final report summarising the main findings. I also plan to disseminate the research findings through publication and conferences. Pseudonymised data will be deposited or submitted to an open source online research data repository at the end of the study. This data may be used for future research.

### **Will my data be used for future research?**

When you agree to take part in a research study, the information we collect may be provided to researchers running other research studies in this organisation and in other organisations. These organisations may be universities, NHS organisations or companies involved in research in this country or abroad. Your information will only be used by organisations and researchers to conduct research and processed on the basis of public interest.

This information will not identify you and will not be combined with other information in a way that could identify you. The information will only be used for the purpose of research, and cannot be used to contact you or to affect you. It will not be used to make decisions about future services available to you, such as insurance.

### **What if I want to complain about the way data is handled?**

If you wish to raise a complaint on how we have handled your personal data, you can contact our Data Protection Officer Mr James Newby who will investigate the matter. If you are not satisfied with our response or believe we are processing your personal data in a way that is not lawful you can complain to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) (<https://ico.org.uk/>).
