



SNAKES AND LADDERS

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- For 3-4 players
- You will need a counter per player (e.g. a small coin) & a dice (virtually flip one here: freeonlinedice.com)
- When you land on a box you have to answer the question correctly to stay or climb the ladder
- If you can't answer correctly, go back to the previous question box. If you go back to a snake you have to go down. If the new question is at the bottom of a ladder, you can't go up the ladder (sorry!)
- If you land at the top of a ladder or bottom of a snake, you are lucky, there is no question to answer
- The answers will either be knowledge you have already studied (go back in your notes to find the answer) or a value judgment (i.e. it will have no right or wrong answer)
- If you throw a 6, take that turn & then throw again to have another turn (two turns maximum per round)
- The winner is the first to the finish - you have to throw the correct number to finish (i.e. if you are on box 33 you have to throw a 3 to finish. It may take some rounds to achieve this)

Tutor notes

- The game is best played in teams of 3 or 4.
- You will need a counter per player (e.g. a small coin) & a dice (or students could virtually flip one, as here: freeonlinedice.com)
- You will need 17 questions. They don't all need to be factual, some could be value judgements - for example What is your opinion of the decline in popularity of X? or Give two reasons why X isn't a good idea.
- The questions are required for boxes: 3, 4, 5, 6, 10, 11, 13, 16, 17, 18, 21, 22, 23, 25, 26, 32 & 33.

- You may want harder questions for those at the foot of a ladder or near to the end
- You may want to ask each group to write a set of questions (or just a few questions). Swap these questions round so each group answers another group's questions.
