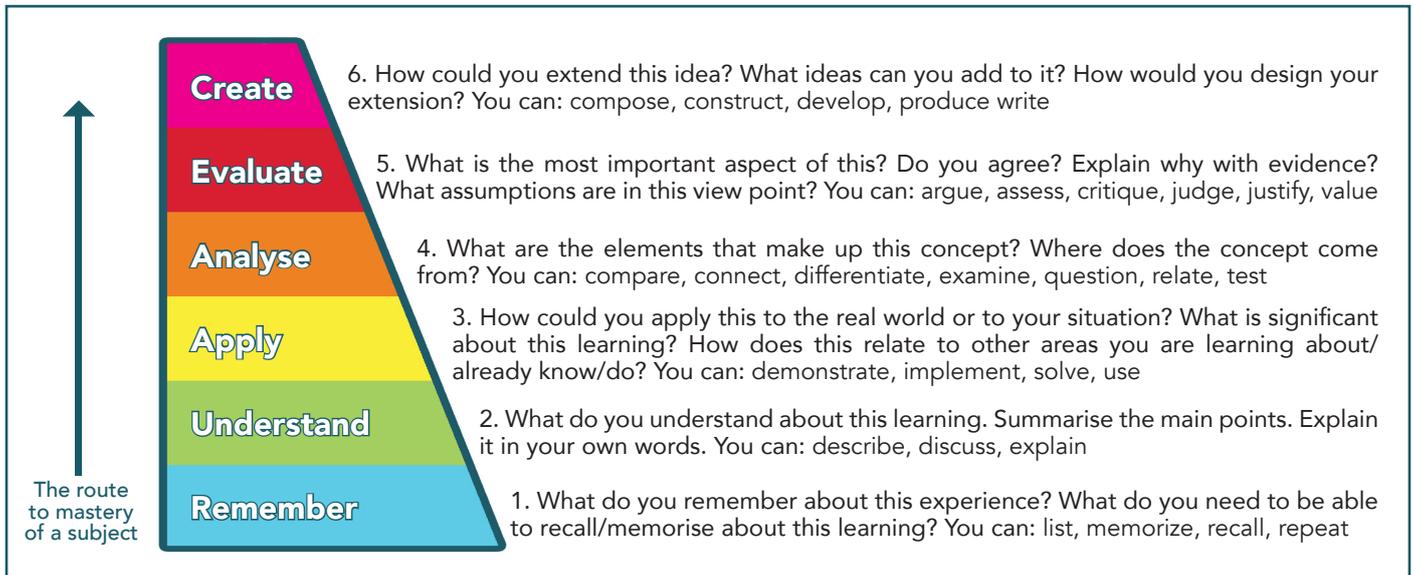




TAXONOMY OF LEARNING & THINKING



Bloom's Taxonomy is a useful model for identifying the stages we progress through as we learn a new concept. The first stages are relatively simple, helping us consider our learning at a basic, but important, foundational stage. As the levels progress we need to think more deeply and begin to apply our learning.

Assess your learning

This model is useful for checking how well you have grasped a subject. Assess where you are on your learning journey with a new concept by answering the following questions. The place where you start to feel unsure may be the level you have reached and where you need to apply some more study and thought. Don't worry if you can't reach all stages - it isn't always possible or desirable to reach the later stages when we are new to an idea. Speak to your tutor if you are worried about this.

1. What facts can I remember from this subject?
2. Can I describe it in my own words?
3. How would I apply this to a real situation? How could I apply it to myself?
4. What's my analysis of this subject?
5. What do I think of this subject? Why?
6. What could I do with this information to create something new?

These questions are also helping you to think critically about a subject.
